NAIROBI INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION ON THE REMOVAL OF WRECKS, 2007
(NAIROBI WRC 2007)
(NMA_C19.2019.Rev.1)

PURPOSE:

To provide guidance on the application of financial security with regards to the removal of hazardous wrecks in accordance to the Wreck Removal Convention (WRC) that has entered into force on 14 April 2015.

CONTENTS:

The WRC makes it compulsory for ships above 300 gross tonnage, flying the flag of a State Party or calling the port(s) of a State Party, to take out insurance or provide other financial security to cover the costs of wreck removal. Ships that call at ports of State Parties are specifically required to produce the WRC Certificate (WRCC) issued by a State Party to attest that they have obtained adequate insurance coverage in accordance to the WRC.

The WRC provides a strict liability, compensation and mandatory insurance regime for States affected by a maritime casualty. For more information, please refer to the WRC Text.

Nauru has acceded to WRC and has entered into force for Nauru on 23 June 2020.

APPLICATION:

- 1) Submit copy of Blue Card (by email to: flag@naurumaritime.com) issued by the vessel's insurer (normally a P&I Club) evidencing that there is in place insurance meeting the liability requirements of the Convention.
- 2) Copy of the vessel's Certificate of Registry (only for vessels that are NOT flagged under Nauru but would like to apply for WRCC from Nauru as their flag State is not a party to the Nairobi WRC 2007)
- 3) Blue Cards should be addressed to:

- 4) Insurer contact details should be made available on the Blue Card for verification purposes.
- 5) The Administration accepts Blue Cards issued by P&I Clubs listed in shipping circular NMA_C15.
