IMPLEMENTATION OF ELECTRONIC CERTIFICATES FOR VESSELS (NMA_C46.2023.Rev.1)

DEFINITIONS:

The following abbreviations stand for:

1. "IMO" – International Maritime Organization
2. "ISM" – International Safety Management Code
3. "PSC" – Port State Control
4. "RO" – Recognized Organization authorized by the Administration in accordance with the IMO Code for Recognised Organizations (RO Code), as amended

The following terms shall mean:

1. "Administration" - the Nauru Maritime Administration
2. "Electronic Certificate" – a certificate issued in an electronic format established or approved by the Administration to ensure viewing compatibility for all intended verifiers.
3. "Electronic Signature" – data in electronic form which is attached to, embedded in, or logically associated with other electronic data to serve as a method of authentication of the issuer and the contents of the electronic data.
4. "Unique Certificate of Endorsement Number" – a string of numbers, letters or symbols used as an identifier to distinguish an electronic certificate issued by, or under the authority of, the Administration from any other electronic certificate issued by, or under the authority of, the Administration.
5. "Verification" – a reliable, secure and continuously available process to confirm the authenticity and validity of an electronic certificate using the Unique Certificate of Endorsement Number and other data contained in, or embedded in, the electronic certificate.

PURPOSE:

To inform all parties on the Guidelines contained in IMO Circular FAL-LEG-MEPC-MS-C.1/Circ.1 and sets out the Administration's requirements for the issuance, acceptance, verification, security and shipboard control of electronic certificates.

IMO Circular FAL-LEG-MEPC-MS-C.1/Circ.1 revokes and replaces FAL.5/Circ.39/Rev.2 and MSC.1/Circ.1665.

APPLICATION:

This Shipping Circular applies to all certificates issued by this Administration, or by Ros duly authorized to issue statutory certificates on behalf of the Administration, for Nauru registered vessels.

CONTENTS:

The implementation of electronic certificates aims to reduce the administrative burden on other Administrations, PSC officers, seafarers etc, caused by the reliance of traditional paper certificates, thereby minimising delays to the operations of Nauru flagged vessels and creating a greener environment.

1. Original hardcopy certificates previously issued by this Administration prior to 01 January 2023 (or in some cases after 01 January 2023) shall remain valid and shall continue to be carried on board until such time they are replaced by electronic certificates.
2. To verify hardcopy certificates, please email copy of the certificate to flag@naurumaritime.com for authentication.
3. All electronic certificates issued by this Administration contain all features in accordance to IMO Circular FAL-LEG-MEPC-MS.C.1/Circ.1. and may be printed or held digitally on board the vessel.
4. The Administration shall ensure that its electronic certificate issuance and verification systems incorporate appropriate measures to protect against unauthorized alteration, fraud and security breaches, and to maintain the availability and integrity of electronic certificate data.
5. The Administration has no objection for ROs to implement and issue electronic certificates on behalf of Nauru so long as the certificates issued contain all the features in accordance to IMO Circular FAL-LEG-MEPC-MS.C.1/Circ.1., and there are instructions provided for verifying the validity and authenticity of the electronic certificates.
6. Shipowners, operators and shipboard personnel shall ensure that electronic certificates are readily accessible on board and are controlled through the Safety Management System in accordance with section 11 of the ISM Code, including appropriate arrangements for retrieval, protection and availability.
7. A copy of this Shipping Circular shall be kept on board to facilitate the acceptance of electronic certificates by other relevant authorities.
8. Methods for verification of Electronic Certificates issued by the Administration:
 - 8.1 Scanning the Quick Response (QR) Code shall result in a copy of the electronic certificate being displayed on the screen.

WARNING: Users shall exercise caution when verifying electronic certificates. A QR Code on a certificate does not, by itself, establish the authenticity of the certificate. For certificates issued by the Administration, users shall verify that any website accessed through a QR Code uses the official naurumaritime.com domain. Where there is any doubt as to the authenticity of a certificate or verification website, confirmation shall be obtained directly from the Administration.
